

Once again, knowing about these programs is easy when you are connected. SERRA MESA FOOD PANTRY

After being opened 3 years we have seen many people come to the pantry and heard many of their stories and have been blessed by some of these people in ways that we could not imagine. We have never shared any of their stories and with her permission, I would like to share Peggy's story.

Peggy first contacted us through an email she sent through our website and we will never forget her subject line: do you feed the homeless in Serra Mesa? Needless to say this line got our attention right away. We were aware of people struggling to put food on the table and we began to learn all of the reasons people would come to the pantry to get help: loss of a job, illness, divorce, or just not enough income. In Peggy's case as we learned over the weeks, she had been evicted from her apartment, lost her job and was unable to live with family or friends. She began living on the streets and because of her school (she still goes to school) she chose to live in Serra Mesa. Peggy's story is inspiring because even though all the hardship, she has overcome many obstacles. She has a shelter (God's Extended Hand) now in downtown San Diego, still no permanent home. She still gets food from the pantry to help her during the days when she is not near the shelter in downtown San Diego. She now volunteers at the pantry on Wednesdays and she has also started to volunteer at Feeding America San Diego, where there is probably an opportunity for a paying job with them. She has joined a local church Mission Village Christian Fellowship where she attends regularly.

Thank you to all of you who have helped us in so many ways. We could not do it without the support of this community that cares so much. We have been blessed also with the most caring and amazing volunteers.

Thank you also to The Rock, Gethsemane Lutheran Church, Mission Village Christian Fellowship and the Serra Mesa Community Council for all your help and support.







JONES PRIMETIME PERFORMS MUSICAL TO TEACH STUDENT BODY ABOUT SCIENCE

On July 11th, at the request of school principal, Rita Powell, the PrimeTime program at Jones Elementary School put on a production of the "Space School Musical" for the entire student body. Approximately 75 PrimeTime student participated in the event after practicing for several months.

The Space School Musical is a program developed by NASA's Discovery Program as part of the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) curriculum movement in education across the United States. This was the first time a SAY site brought NASA's entire Space School Musical to a school! MEMORABLE SERRA MESA SCENES - DO YOU RECOGNIZE THEM?

Serra Mesa has some special scenes -- buildings, objects, places, gardens -- that readily catch your eye when you see them. That is, IF you see them. It's a labryinth made from rocks laid out in a design for strolling around and perhaps contemplating what life is about. Know where it is?

Summary of July 18 Meeting

Capital Improvement Projects for Serra Mesa for next fiscal year: SMPG reaffirmed their support of the list that was submitted to the City in October 2012:

- Former Serra Mesa Library Building on Sandrock Road be re-used. Suggestions were historical model
 railroad center, senior center, childcare, and community center. A presentation was made on July 18 by
 a couple interested in the old library building being converted to an historical model railroad museum.
 SMPG decided that we need to ascertain the condition of the building and solicit input from the community
 on the reuse of the building.
- A sidewalk or paved pathway for the roadway from Mission Village to the Qualcomm Stadium Trolley Station.
- Cardinal Road in the Birdland area widened to relieve traffic congestion.
- Improved irrigation system for Cabrillo Heights Park, using re-cycled water, if possible to improve field conditions.
- Construct median improvements and new welcome signs for our community.

Agenda for September 19 Meeting

AeaLAS Project Conditional Use Permit (CUP) – The Guild Mortgage Building, across from Taft Middle School at 9160 Gramercy Drive was sold. The owner is asking for a conditional use permit for a charter school, kindergarten through eighth grade, in the 30,466 square foot building and for a new playground. This site is designated for neighborhood commercial use but a school can be permitted with a Process Three CUP. Process Three requires a Hearing Officer hearing (public meeting) and subsequent decision by the officer.

ACIC (Afghan Community Islamic Center) CUP Renewal, Process Three, at 3333 Sandrock Road – The presentation at the February 2013 SMPG meeting indicated the following items were being requested: 1) 10 year CUP, 2) Add additional capacity during the week (primary purpose is for funerals), and 3) Education Center for youth. No interior and exterior modification is requested.

Agenda for October 17 Meeting

Amendments to the Hickman Fields General Development Plan, located in Kearny Mesa near REI. The plan includes additional sports fields, a recreation center, a multi-use aquatic complex, pedestrian and vehicular circulation, parking, security and parking lot lighting, children's play area and comfort stations/concession stands. According to the Serra Mesa Facilities Financing Plan (guide to public facility spending) Serra Mesa is expected to contribute 10% of the total cost.

Continuing Items

Cabrillo Heights Park Fields: SMPG received a response from the City regarding our request for fees from the Broadstone Kearny Mesa Project to completely redo the Cabrillo Heights fields to correct structural issues (e.g., irrigation system, cobble stones, etc). We're waiting for a legal determination.

Rady Children's Hospital Construction: A 67,000 s.f. building to replace the bungalows is proposed for use for office and meeting rooms. The project is going through a Substantial Conformance Review which means staff can approve the project. Rady's would work with the community and the contractors to reduce traffic and parking impacts on the community.

Management Assessment Districts (MAD): Description: "A Maintenance Assessment District (MAD) is a legal mechanism by which property owners can vote to assess themselves to receive enhanced maintenance, landscaping, and lighting services. These services are above and beyond the City's baseline general services." The amount will vary with each MAD and the needs of the community. The community determines their needs. There's a very involved process described at http://www.sandiego.gov/park-and-recreation/pdf/madformationhandout. pdf. and http://www.sandiego.gov/park-and-recreation/mads/mad4.shtml.

Comments from residents to the Serra Mesa Community Council indicate a concern about the deterioration of Serra Mesa and an interest in rejuvenation. SMPG decided to form a committee to make a recommendation about proceeding with a community discussion and the process for this discussion. Other

Broadstone at Kearny Mesa – With the development of the project at the southwest corner of Aero and Sandrock the pork chop (free right turn) is being removed. It will be replaced by a dedicated right turn. As we understand it the City has a policy to remove pork chops due to speed and pedestrian safety issues.

BROADSTONE KEARNY MESA: PROJECT OVERVIEW

Broadstone Kearny Mesa is comprised of a 7.52-acre site and will contain 360 residential apartments with 5,000 SF of supporting retail. The property will offer a full amenity package, including 11 fully landscaped courtyards and a resort-style pool with a resident's club. The property will consist of one bedroom and two bedroom apartment units in a 3-4 story "wrap" style building, with four stories of wood-framed apartments wrapping an internal parking structure. The architecture is inspired by the historically rich context of the neighborhood, with homages to aviation, industrial, and mid-century residential styles.

In addition to the 600 feet of landscaped frontage on Aero Drive, the building form has been designed with several "pocket-courtyards". This limits the horizontal dimension of a particular façade, helping to break up the overall building massing with such relief. Additionally, the building is designed with multiple "green-building" features and will achieve a highly coveted LEED certification– one of the highest certifications granted to projects adhering to a concise framework for identifying and implementing practical and measurable green building design, construction, operations and maintenance solutions.

FRIENDS OF RUFFIN CANYON

Week of Hope, a faith-based organization which offers young people experience doing community service away from home brought great volunteers to us intermittently all summer. In fact, we had more offers of help from outside organizations than we had FRC volunteers who could lead them. We are looking for more volunteers from our own neighborhood in Serra Mesa to help as well, please contact us and leave a message at (858) 565-2473 if you like to help out. Sometimes Monica Fuentes takes the volunteers around the streets of Serra Mesa to pick up litter.

The native butterfly garden at Taft made it through the summer looking and smelling beautiful. Come visit, you may find plants you would like in your own landscape.

What's the secret to drought tolerance in native plants? Mycorrhizae from soil fungus make physical connection with the roots of plants in dry, nutrient poor soil. Plants provide carbohydrates from photosynthesis in exchange for water and nutrients brought up by the fungus. If plants are watered too much, it no longer needs water from the fungus, and throws it off to conserve its own carbohydrates. Then the plant starves for nutrients and has no protection from drought. To preserve the mycorrhizae, native plant gardeners disturb the soil as little as possible. Don't weed with a spade and dig only enough space for the root ball when we put in transplants.

The 29th Annual Coastal Cleanup Day is coming up on Saturday, September 21st from 9 a.m. - 12 noon. Of course you can volunteer at any of 90 cleanup sites in San Diego County; we will be hosting an event here in Serra Mesa with dumpsters at Taft. If you are able to participate please bring your own refillable water bottle, gloves, and bucket to avoid adding your own trash to the collection. Prizes and fame will be awarded for the best decorated buckets. Go to www.cleanupday.org to register and read details.

FRC thinks it is time to revisit the possibility of a trail in Ruffin Canyon. Last spring it was approved by our Planning Group, but the San Diego River Conservancy got the idea that the neighborhood didn't want a trail and the funding went elsewhere. FRC believes there is strong support for the project, which can get even stronger with more time to address concerns. State funding is still available. It is time we had something special here to make Serra Mesa a destination. Go to www.sdrc.ca.gov for information on the San Diego River Ruffin Canyon Trail & Urban Walk.

The labryinth is located on the space in front of the Gethsemane Lutheran Church. Stop by 2696 Melbourne (off Shawn Avenue from Mission Village Drive) and check it out. I asked the minister, Gloria Espeseth (also Board Member of SM Community Council), to tell us what that's about: "The labyrinth at Gethsemane was laid in 2002 using good old Serra Mesa rocks which surfaced when the ground was leveled for a building project in 2001. We used a pattern from a book on labyrinths and only had one misstep leading to a dead end. There was an easy fix to enable the walk to flow as it was designed to. We placed the labyrinth on the unused front lot so that the community could be welcomed and feel comfortable using it 24/7. Because we had a sizeable space, the path is wide enough for more than one person to use it at a time. It is a bit rustic and uneven so comfortable shoes are recommended."

A labyrinth is not a maze...it is a path leading to a center with one way in and out. If you trust the path, you will walk to the center and then back out. Labyrinths have been found in ancient ruins with the oldest

one in a Christian church dating from the 13th century in the Cathedral in Chartes, France. While many people use them for prayer and meditation, walking the labyrinth can be used for taking time to think through a problem or take time to celebrate a goodness in your life. The people of Gethsemane invite anyone who is interested to visit and walk the labyrinth.

Also I had asked if anyone knew the creator of those stacked rocks. And Luther Handshy, who lives on Sandrock Road, responded: "The rocks were stacked by my neighbor Steve Zalfen. He puts them back up when the kids knock them down. Steve also put the rings around the base of the palm trees."
